Jesus is the True Vine .


Jesus says that He is the vine and we are the branches. Branches grow out from a vine and receive their food from the main stem. They grow leaves and bear fruit.

Sometimes a branch of a vine needs to be pruned. A bit gets cut off, but then it grows even better where it was cut. In the same way, sometimes God lets us suffer, but then our souls can grow even stronger

## Jn.15:1-8 | The Feast of St. Joseph the Worker - May 1

"May Day" has long been dedicated to labour and the working man. In 1955, Pope Pius XII used the 1st of May to establish the feast of St. Joseph the Worker in order to Christianize the concept of labour and give to all workers a model and a protector.

By his daily labour, offered to God with patience and joy, Joseph provided for his family, becoming an example to all labourers. It is eminently fitting that Joseph, a working man who became the foster-father of Christ and patron of the universal Church, should be honoured on this day.

Pope Francis tells us that Joseph, "a carpenter who earned an honest living to provide for his family," teaches us "the value, the dignity and the joy of what it means to eat bread that is the fruit of one's own labour." This aspect of Joseph's character provided Pope Francis the opportunity to launch an appeal in favour of work, which is "a burning social issue" even in countries with a certain level of well-being, as "there is a renewed need to appreciate the importance of dignified work, of which St. Joseph is an exemplary patron." Work, Pope Francis says, "is a means of participating in the work of salvation, an opportunity to hasten the coming of the Kingdom, to develop our talents and abilities, and to put them at the service of society and fraternal communion." Those who work "are cooperating with God himself, and in some way become creators of the world around

Pope Francis encourages everyone "to rediscover the value, the importance and the necessity of work for bringing about a new normal from which no one is excluded." The Pope calls everyone to "review our priorities" son at all should be without work".

# The True Vine

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that He is the true vine that God intended Israel to be, the source of divine life and wisdom for the nations. In Baptism, each of us was joined to Him by the Holy Spirit. As a branch grows from a tree, our souls are to draw life from Him, nourished by His word and the Eucharist.

Paul, in the First Reading, seeks to be grafted onto the visible expression of Christ the true vine, His Church. Once the chief persecutor of the Church, Paul encounters initial resistance and suspicion. But he is known by his fruits, by his powerful witness to the Lord working in his life.

We too are commanded today to bear good fruits as His disciples so that our lives give glory to God. Like Paul's life, our lives must bear witness to His goodness. Jesus cautions us, however, that if we're bearing fruit, we can expect that God will "prune" us as a gardener trims and cuts back a plant so that it will grow stronger and bear even more fruit. He is teaching us today how to look at our sufferings and trials with the eyes of faith. We need to see our struggles as pruning, by which we are being disciplined and trained so that we can grow in holiness and bear fruits of righteousness.

We need to always remain rooted in Him, as the Epistle tells us. We remain in Him by keeping His commandment of love, by pondering His words, letting them dwell richly in us, and by always seeking to do what pleases Him. In everything we must be guided by humility, remembering that apart from Him we can do nothing. As we sing in the Psalm, we must fulfill our vows, turning to the Lord in worship, proclaiming his praises, until all families come to know His justice in their lives.

# May - The Month of Mary.

The month of May is the "month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady," and it is the occasion for a "moving tribute of faith and love" which Catholics in every part of the world pay to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration.

In this month, too, "the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance" (Paul VI: Encyclical on the Month of May, no. 1).

This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. In this way, the Church was able to Christianize the secular feasts which took place at that time. In the 16th century, books appeared and fostered this devotion. The practice became especially popular among the members of the Jesuit Order, and from there it spread to the whole Church.

There are many ways to celebrate this particular devotion. Most churches have a daily recitation of the rosary. Some include the crowning of Our Lady's statue; a statue of Mary is honored with a wreath of blossoms to indicate Mary's virtues, virtues that are to be imitated by the faithful. The important thing is that Mary be honored in a special way.

# How can we honor Mary this month?

Simple, pray the rosary. In all the hundreds of apparitions of Mary she has constantly called us to pray the holy rosary for the salvation of souls. This is an easy yet powerful way to honor her this month. It has been said that each time we pray the rosary, a rose is added to the crown of Mary. This isn't something that needs to be done alone or in private. Pray it as a family and allow Mary to wrap her mantle of peace around all of you.

Pope Francis also encourages us to rediscover the beauty of praying the Rosary at home this May, traditionally a time when the People of God express with particular intensity their love and devotion for the Blessed Virgin Mary within the family. The restrictions of the pandemic have made us come to appreciate all the more this "family" aspect.

Pope Francis says that contemplating the face of Christ with the heart of Mary our Mother will make us even more united as a spiritual family and will help us overcome this time of trial.
