

In the Old Testament, God gave His people rules that said they should punish the people who sinned. That's why in today's Gospel the Pharisees and scribes


brought a sinful woman to Jesus to see what He had to say about the law.

## 5TH SUNDAY OF LENT - 6TH APRIL 2025 - YEAR C

### A New Deed.

PILGRIM The Liturgy this Lent has shown us the God of the Exodus. He is a mighty and gracious God, who out of faithfulness to His covenant has worked "marvels" for His people, as today's Psalm puts it. But "what was done before," Isaiah tells us in the First Reading, is nothing compared to the "something new" that He will do in the future. The First Reading and Psalm look back to the marvelous deeds Monchy of the Exodus. Both see in the Exodus a pattern and prophecy of the future, when God will restore the fortunes of His people fallen in sin. The readings today look forward to a still greater Exodus, when God will gather in the exiled tribes of Israel that had been scattered to the four winds, the ends of the earth. The new Exodus that Israel waited and hoped for has come in the death and resurrection of Jesus. Like the adulterous woman in the Gospel, all have been spared by the Lord's compassion. All have heard His words of forgiveness, His urging to repentance, to be sinners no more. Like Paul in the Epistle, Christ has taken possession of every one, claimed each as a child of our heavenly Father. σ In the Church, God has formed a people for Himself to č announce His praise, just as Isaiah said He would. And as Isaiah promised, He has given His "chosen people" living waters to drink in the desert wastelands of the world. But our God is ever a God of the future, not of the past. We are **D** to live with hopeful hearts, forgetting "the past" and straining "ahead for what is still to come", as Paul tells us. His salvation, Paul says, is power in the present, "the power of His resurrec-S <sup>Q</sup> tion." We are to live awaiting a still greater and final Exodus, pursuing the goal, "the prize" of God's upward calling, striving in faith to attain the last new thing God promises - "the resurrection of the dead." ### LENT: HEARING THE CRY OF THE POOR.

Each year, the Season of Lent is offered to us as a time of renewal. Our renewal becomes concrete when we practice the self-denial which allows us to live our faith more authentically.

The almsgiving we do helps *us* express our gratitude, and allows *us* to exercise generosity. However, Lent can also be a time to focus beyond ourselves, a time of renewal to hear the cry of the poor and grow in solidarity with them. Ultimately, this spiritual renewal helps us grow closer to our Lord who tells us that if we wish to love Him, we must express that love as love for the least of our brothers and sisters.

It all starts with desire and a few choices. If we recognize a desire to be more attentive to the poor and to grow in affection for and in solidarity with them, then it is likely that this is a grace we have received. If we don't feel this desire, we can ask the Lord to help us grow in a desire to hear better the cry of those most in need.

If we spend Lent reflecting upon the situation of the poor, we will begin to pray differently. We will see not only see their radical dependence upon God, but we will find ourselves turning to God on their behalf before we ask anything of God for ourselves. This kind of prayer purifies our prayer. It helps us pray with a renewed spirit. It frees us from so many of the demands we can place on God, especially for things like our own comfort or success or just getting things our way.

With the poor as our prayer companions, we can surrender more easily and ask God for what really matters - first on their behalf and then for ourselves. Our prayer for ourselves will more freely become a prayer that we might be transformed to be better servants for others, especially conscious of those on the margins of society. It will ultimately lead us to ask the Lord to help us make our lifestyle more simple. It can lead us to ask to be freed from our dependence upon so many of the benefits of the unjust social structures of our world.

Lent spent hearing the cry of the poor starts with awareness, is spent in growing solidarity with them, and leads to deeper compassion and transformative prayer.
