# VISION 2020-DISCIPLES ON MISSION

8TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 27TH FEBRUARY 2022 - YEAR C

### Out of the Heart.

In today's readings we hear Jesus speaking in Galilee, and a Jewish sage named Sirach writing in Jerusalem more than a century earlier. The two of them touch upon a single truth: the words that come out of us make known the hidden thoughts within us. Speech reveals the secrets of the heart. Sirach teaches that speaking is "the test of a man" and his character. One who is upright will utter words that are truthful and encouraging to others. But one whose heart is cluttered with "rubbish" will be exposed, since the "fruit" of his mouth speaks volumes about the "tree" that produces it. Sirach also compares the testing of our words to clay fired in a kiln - if properly prepared, a useful vessel emerges; but if the clay is not fully dried, it will break apart in the extreme heat. In a similar way, Jesus insists that a person speaks "out of what fills his heart." He too compares our speech, whether good or bad, to what grows on a tree: "There is no sound tree that produces rotten fruit, nor again a rotten tree that produces sound fruit." Both readings urge us to make wholesome speech a habit. After all, much about who we are is brought to light through what we say. But there's an additional step. The Lord is asking us to look inward, to examine our hearts and fill them with the "store of goodness" that God desires. Why do purity of heart and speech matter so much? Because, as Jesus declares elsewhere: "by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned". They matter because they help to decide our final judgment. In the Second Reading, Paul reminds us that God will destroy death forever, and if we are to share in this victory and live forever with the Lord, then we must take all steps necessary to give our hearts and lips to what is good.

Preparing for Lent:

“Rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the Lord, your God.” Joel 2

We say we deeply desire that the six weeks of Lent will be a time of religious experience for us. We are preparing to “rend” or *tear open* our hearts. This is a time to let our hearts be opened to examine what in us needs forgiveness and healing and opened to new graces, new generosity, new compassion.

We want to “turn away from sin and be faithful to the gospel.” We want to reflect on the meaning of the death and resurrection of Jesus for us. We want it to become personal. Jesus was broken and given for each one of us. Our own sins - what we have done and what we have failed to do - have been forgiven. We want to feel gratitude and let it transform how we feel about the sin of others. We desire to experience mercy and become more mercy-filled in our relationship with others. Experiencing our own poverty, we want to be renewed in a dedication to notice, have compassion for and stand in solidarity with the poor of our world. Then the Spiritual and Corporal works of mercy can come alive in us.

This Ash Wednesday we will wear the cross of ashes that says we are not afraid to walk around in the world with this sign which indicates that we know our life on this earth is not all there is. It says that we believe in everlasting life. It says that we know who we are and want to choose to take advantage of the days ahead. We remember where we came from and where we’re going.

On Ash Wednesday, a journey to turn to God with all our heart begins.
