Today we celebrate the feast day of the Blessed Trinity. The word Trinity is a title for God that tells us that He is three Persons in one God.

Before Jesus came, the people didn't know that God was a Trinity. The Israelites knew that there was only one God, but they didn't know very much about Him. Jesus showed the people that there were three Persons in God when He taught them about Himself and the Father and the Holy Spirit.

The three Persons in the Blessed Trinity are all equal but different. We cannot understand this, but we believe it because Jesus taught it. It is one of the Mysteries of our Faith.

What does the Holy Trinity do for us? We know that God the Father made everything and we are intended to go back to Him. The Holy Spirit guides us towards Him, and Jesus is the way.

Every time you make the Sign of the Cross or say the "Glory Be" you are praying to the Blessed Trinity.

At the Last Supper, Jesus changed bread and wine into His own Body and Blood. He has the power to do this because He is God. He did this because He wanted to stay with us even after He died and went into Heaven.

Jesus comes to us in every Mass.

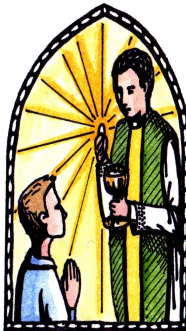
The priest takes the place of Jesus, saying the words that Jesus said at the Last Supper, and the bread and wine become the real Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus even though they still look like bread and wine.

How do I receive Communion well?

1. Be ready! Think about what is going to happen. Make sure that you don't have any big sins on your soul. If you do, then go to confession first.

2. Don't eat or drink anything other than water or medicine for an hour before going to Holy Communion. This is a sign of respect for Our Lord.

3. After receiving Holy Communion, take some time to thank Jesus for coming to you and talk to Him. He is your best friend and loves spending time with you!

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY- 15TH JUNE 2025 -YEAR C

The Heart of the Trinity

In today's Liturgy we're swept through time in glorious procession from before earth and sky were set in place to the coming of the Spirit upon the new creation, the Church.

We begin in the heart of the Trinity, as we listen to the testimony of Wisdom in the First Reading. Eternally begotten, the firstborn of God, He is poured forth from of old in the loving delight of the Father. Through Him, the heavens were established, the foundations of the earth fixed. From before the beginning, He was with the Father as His "Craftsman," the artisan by Whom all things were made. And He took special delight, He tells us, in the crowning glory of God's handiwork, the human race, the "sons of men."

In today's Psalm, He comes down from heaven, is made a little lower than the angels, comes among us as "the Son of Man". All things are put under His feet so that He can restore to humanity the glory for which we were made from the beginning, the glory lost by sin. He tasted death that we might be raised to life in the Trinity, that His name might be made glorious over all the earth.

Through the Son, we have gained grace and access in the Spirit to the Father, as Paul boasts in the Epistle. The Spirit, the Love of God, has been poured out into our hearts, a Spirit of adoption, making us children of the Father once more. This is the Spirit that Jesus promises in today's Gospel.

His Spirit comes as divine gift and anointing, to guide us to all truth, to show us "the things that are coming," the things that were meant to be from before all ages, that we will find peace and union in God, share the life of the Trinity, and dwell in God as He dwells in us.

Corpus Christi: The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

The Feast of the Sacred Body and Blood of Jesus which is given to us in the Most Holy Eucharist is a profound, prophetic and powerful Feast in the liturgical year of the Church. On this Feast day we proclaim our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. We are reminded that Jesus Christ still gives Himself to us, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. We also proclaim that this same Jesus lives within each one of us who are baptized into His Body, the Church, of which we are members.

After the Mass of the day, we usually follow the ancient and beautiful custom in the Latin Rite of the Catholic Church, the Corpus Christi procession. The consecrated Host, the Body of the Lord, is reposed in a monstrance (from a Latin phrase meaning to show or reveal), and the faithful process the Body of the Lord through the streets surrounding the church building singing songs of worship.

We proclaim, by our attendance at this Mass and procession, that we know the Lord is truly present in the Eucharist and in our lives, giving Himself to all who call upon him. Jesus Christ is not dead. He is alive! He has been raised from the dead! He still walks through our streets in this hour as truly as He walked the streets of Galilee.

The world is a place that God still loves so much that He continues to send His Son to save, recreate and transform it from within. The Corpus Christi observance more than ever symbolizes the ongoing redemptive mission of Jesus Christ, and our participation in it. He comes to dwell within us and we live our lives now in Him. We are invited to become a living monstrance carrying the Lord within us, to be living manifestations of the Lord, showing Him forth to the world in word and deed.

In the Holy Eucharist we receive the Divine Host, Jesus the Christ. Through our Baptism, Jesus Christ has taken up residence within each one of us. We are invited to enthrone the Lord in our hearts. We carry Him into the real world with us. We proclaim that the Lord continues to come into the world, through the Church.
